- SAT and/or ACT
 - SAT and ACT preparation classes are available at ACA – see your counselor for details.
 - Take the SAT subject test in May or June that coincides with your subject area of strength.
 - Registration Tips:
 - To make sure your scores are reported to ACA, use our school code of 052774
 - Take advantage of sending your scores to at least four colleges for free when you register for the SAT and/or the ACT.
 - If applying to multiple UC campuses, you can list one UC campus code and all campuses you apply to will receive your scores.
 - If applying to multiple Cal State campuses, use the CSU Mentor Code and all campuses you apply to will receive your scores.

 - To register for the ACT go to www.act.org
- AP tests are administered in May at ACA.

- Meet with your academic counselor in February for a junior graduation review.
- 4-year college eligibility
 - To be 4-year College eligible, a student must pass all A-G courses with grades of C or better. Some colleges will accept grades of a C-.
 - Students who need to retake classes to meet 4-year college eligibility must complete the class prior to, or during their senior year.
 - NOTE: Meeting 4-year college eligibility requirements will not guarantee college acceptance. **See college websites for GPA and SAT/ACT acceptance averages.**
